Stalls, Bedding, & Hay

• All stabling requests should be submitted through a trainer or one member of a group by the Monday before the start of the show.

Hunter/Jumper Tack, Attire, & Equipment

• Traditional attire and equipment is required during competition. Judges will follow USEF/USHJA rules for tack and equipment during competition rounds. The intention of this is to prepare competitors for rated level horse show practices and rules.

Dressage Tack, Attire, & Equipment

• Traditional attire is suggested but not required.

Lost & Found

• Located at the show office during the show. After the show, any lost and found items will be delivered to the main HPW office located at the entrance to the facility.



WARM UP DAY

"Ticketed Rounds" will be offered from 11:00 AM - 5:00 PM on Fridays at each show in the Hunter and Jumper rings. Warm Up day is intended for introduction to the competition space before the show, it is not intended for extensive schooling or lessons in the show rings.

- All riders must be checked in and wearing a number. Trainer numbers can be given at the show office.
- Rounds will be permitted on a first come, first-serve basis for each height section.
- Limit 3 minutes per round rounds can be used for jumping the posted course, hacking, or jumping portions of the posted course.
- Arenas are not open for hacking before or after the posted warm up schedule.
- Riders exceeding the 3 minute limit will incur an additional schooling round fee.
- Only one trainer is permitted per 3 minute window.
- No changing of jump heights or direction is allowed.
- Absolutely no schooling will be permitted 30 minutes after sunset each day. Any end-of-day over fences schooling or schooling outside of arena hours must be confirmed with management through back gate staff.
- *Warm up schedule will be posted on the website



USHJA OUTREACH PROGRAM

We are pleased to offer USHJA Outreach classes to support entry into the USEF and USHJA showing environment. Outreach classes provide the opportunity to earn national recognition in classes from (Intro) walk/trot to 3'0" in Hunter and Equitation sections and .60m-1.20m in Jumper sections at rated and local shows. Any rider may compete in Outreach Hunter, Jumper, and Equitation classes, but riders wishing to earn points and national recognition must be a USHJA Outreach member or any other USHJA member category.

USHJA Membership is NOT required to compete in any Sand Hill Equestrian Events classes/show.

USHJA Outreach Membership is free to sign up and only required for riders/horses who wish to be eligible for Outreach Program Awards. More information is located on page 18.

THOROUGHBRED INCENTIVE PROGRAM



Classes and divisions are offered for the Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Incentive Program, which also earns you points towards the year-end Thoroughbred Sporthorse Challenge! For more information, or help getting a TIP number, please contact <u>suzy@norcal-thoroughbred-events.</u> com

TIP awards will be given at each show by the TIP program. Thoroughbred only classes will be run concurrently and given separate placings. More information on these classes is provided under specifications.



SAND HILL EQUESTRIAN EVENTS RULES AND POLICIES

CLASS ADD/SCRATCH POLICIES AND FEES

Same day class adds will be allowed based on schedule and subject to management discretion.

- Hunter/Jumper
 - Add/scratch form must be processed in the show office before the start of the class
 - Add/scratch slip must be brought to the back gate after this is processed at the office
- Dressage
 - Requested adds after the closing date will be subject to management's approval and may be required to do their test(s) at the end of already scheduled dressage times
 - \$45 fee for dressage test scratches after the start of the show

SCHOOLING POLICY

Schooling is permitted on warm up day following the ticketed round schedule and rules. Non-Judged classes are available during the show at each height section on Saturday and Sunday. Riders may also choose (at the back gate) to ride any class as a "Non-Judged" round to provide additional schooling opportunities during the show. Schooling, jumping, hacking, or teaching lessons in the Warm Up rings is allowed from sunrise to sunset during the show. Schooling or hacking in the show arenas outside of posted warm up or showing hours, or before or after the conclusion of the show each day, is not guaranteed and must be approved by management in advance.

SCRATCH AND CANCELLATION POLICY

Refund/Show Scratch Policy

- A "show scratch" applies to any horse entered into the show that withdraws from the competition.
 - Show scratch must be delivered to management via <u>entries.woodsideschoolingshows@gmail.com</u>
 - Show scratch received before the entry closing date will receive a full refund.
 - Show scratch received after the entry closing date will be charged an office processing fee of \$35
 - Horse or tack stall reservations canceled after the closing date will be charged \$50 per stall
 - Show scratch during the show will be charged all applicable show entry, stabling/haul in fees in addition to any fees for schooling rounds or classes that the horse participated in.

• Hunter/ Jumper Add/Scratch policy

- Same day adds will be allowed for Hunter/Jumper classes only and are subject to management discretion based on the schedule.
- Add/scratch form must be processed in the show office before the start of the class
- Add/scratch slip must be brought to the back gate after processing at the show office
- Dressage Add/Scratch Policy
 - Requested adds after the closing date will be subject to management's approval and may be required to do their test(s) at the end of already scheduled dressage times
 - No same day adds for dressage tests
 - Dressage test scratch or show scratch after the start of the show (Fridays at 8 AM or 24 hours before the first class of the show) will be required to pay all class and entry fees. Class fees, HPW facility fee, and office fees will apply.

SHOW SCRATCHES, STALL CANCELLATION POLICY, AND FEES

If you are no longer able to attend the horse show, we will accept show scratches before the closing date and you will not incur any changes. If you need to cancel your show entry after the closing date the following fees will apply:

- Show Scratch Fee \$35 per horse
- Horse or Tack Stall Cancellation Fee \$50 per stall

For more information on the policies for class add/scratches, show scratches & stall cancellation **refer to the Schooling Show Policies, Rules and Regulations section** at the end of this prize list

PAYMENT POLICY

Payment is due in full prior to the close of the show. Competitors must leave a method of payment on file at the show office when checking in. Payment is accepted in the form of a check or credit card.

- **Competitors are required to close out at the show office before leaving the show** management reserves the right to charge any remaining balance on file at the end of the show. We recommend exhibitors review their bill and close out at the horse show office when finished.
- **Open Balances:** competitors who do not close out their balance or review their bill in person at the show office forfeit the right to adjust any show charges. Final balances will be charged to the payment method on file.
- Prior outstanding balances must be paid before picking up show numbers.
- Any checks returned by the bank will be charged a \$35 penalty in addition to the returned check charges made by the bank.

STABLING

- The Horse Park at Woodside offers 12x12 box stalls.
- Shavings and hay must be ordered through email outlined under contact information.
- Feed options: alfalfa, grass mix (alfalfa/grass), meadow grass, timothy.
- Hay & Shavings orders should be placed no later than 11 AM for same day delivery.

CROSS COUNTRY SCHOOLING POLICY

Cross Country schooling at The Horse Park at Woodside is run separate from the Woodside Show Series. XC schooling must be registered and paid through the main HPW office.

EQUINE HEALTH POLICIES

• Equine Health Attestation & Vaccinations

All competitors must complete an Equine Health Attestation AND carry proof/certification of vaccination for each horse attending the show. Certification/proof of vaccinations may be requested at any time by competition management.

• Equine Health Attestation Forms

Forms can be turned in via email at: entries.woodsideschoolingshows@gmail.com prior to arrival or immediately upon arrival to the facility. PDFs' of Health forms can be found on our website at: <u>https://woodsideshowseries.com/</u>

• Temperature Checks

All horses entering the facility must have maintained a 3-day, twice daily temperature log prior to arriving that is available for review by competition management if requested. All horses on the facility must have their temperature monitored twice daily during their stay at the Horse Park. Show management will be monitoring the temperature logs and reserves the right to cancel any entries who do not comply with the above health & safety policy.

Call a veterinarian and alert show management immediately if a horse's temperature reads 101.5F/38.6C.

HPW STALL USE POLICIES

The Horse Park at Woodside is implementing the following as a Stall Use Policy effective April 1st, 2019. Going forward stalls will be inventoried before and after each rental to ensure that stalls are returned in the same condition as they were received. Any damages to rental stalls will be the financial responsibility of the owner, exhibitor and/or trainer.

Please review the following guidelines and contact the main office with any questions or concerns:

- 1. Do not damage stalls: No staples, nails, bolts, screws, liquid nail, rubber cement, duct tape, paint or other products to be used on or in the stalls.
- 2. Decorations must be attached using temporary set-ups (wire or plastic ties) and removed prior to check out.
- 3. Name cards must be removed prior to check-out and leave no residue on stall surfaces.
- 4. Do not remove any part of the stalls.
- 5. Manure only in dumpsters.
- 6. No vehicles in the aisles between stall rows.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations will be enforced for the duration of the show and apply to all competitors, riders and visitors on the property.

Entries - All riders must complete and return an entry. Entries will be accepted until the closing date. An additional administrative late fees of \$35 per entry will be applied for entries received after the show closing date.

ASTM rated hard hats must be worn by all riders when mounted.

Waivers must be signed by all riders prior to undertaking any riding. This includes riding in the warm up arenas. For riders under 18, the Waiver must be signed by a parent, guardian or trainer.

Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being ridden, exercised or walked.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times and are not permitted in the arenas or on courses.

Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, cancel entries, awards or prizes and/or adjust the time schedule, combine, scratch or move classes as necessary without claims or damage. All judge's decisions are final.

Stall Use is by reservation only and availability is subject to change. By renting a stall at The Horse Park, you agree to abide by the stall use policies.

Feed & Shavings can be purchased before arriving and during the show either through online entry or with the attached Feed & Shavings form in the Prize List.

Move-In for horse stalls starts at 8AM on check-in date.

Haul In Fee: Haul in fees are applicable to anyone not stabling and hauling a horse onto the property for the show. Haul in fee is waived only for annual full use members of HPW for 2024.

HPW Facility Fee: All Competitors will be charged a \$35 HPW facility fee, regardless of HPW membership or boarding status.

Office Fee: All Competitors will be charged a \$38 Office Fee, regardless of HPW membership or boarding status. This fee goes directly to supporting the quality of our shows.

CDFA Fee: All Competitors will be charged a \$14 CDFA Fee. CDFA is the California Department of Food & Agriculture. The schooling show is required to collect a CDFA fee of \$14 per entry. All CDFA fees are remitted to the CDFA and fund their Equine Medication Monitoring Program (EMMP). More information at CDFA website.

Non-Competing horses that are stabled or hauled in for the show will be required to pay for applicable entry fees: haul in or stabling fee, office fee, CDFA fee, HPW facility fee.

Schooling: No juniors or amateurs are allowed to school over fences without having a person in charge on the ground. Please refer to our schooling policy above for more information.

Arenas: Competitors are restricted to show arenas and warm up arenas. Competitors who are not also members of The Horse Park are not permitted to use "member only" arenas. Members who are not competing are restricted to "members only" arenas and may not use show designated arenas.

Lunging is permitted in designated lunging areas only. Do not lunge in warm up or show arenas.

Photo and Video Consent: By competing or attending competitions or events with Sand Hill Equestrian Events, exhibitors and spectators grant permission to the unrestricted rights to use photographs and/or video footage from the schooling show for the purpose of promotion of The Woodside Schooling Shows in various mediums.

Photography: No unauthorized photography is allowed during the Woodside Show Series. Any unauthorized photographers will be asked to leave the property.

No trainers allowed on foot in the show ring during competition. Trainers are allowed in the ring on warmup days.

Management reserves the right to not allow same day adds based on schedule availability.

Management and Judges reserve the right to dismiss riders displaying extreme aggression or force, or riders who seem unsafe.

DIVISIONS, SPECIFICATIONS, AND DEFINITIONS

DRESSAGE

- USDF & USEA tests will be offered at the April, September, and October shows.
- USDF Introductory, Training, First, and Second Level
- USEA Starter, Beginner Novice, Novice, Training, Modified, and Prelim
- Ride times will be posted on the website: WoodsideSchoolingShows.com
- Woodside Show Series Summer Festival (June) will not offer dressage classes.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

The following enterable sections will be offered at all shows. Division champion and reserve awarded at each show. Year end division champions and reserve champions will be awarded after the Fall Finale show based on cumulative points earned throughout the year.

All Hunter classes will count toward the USHJA Outreach Program.

EQUITATION CLASSES

All equitation and medal classes are open to junior and adult amateur riders only. Classes will not be included in hunter division placings for 2' and above. Equitation class placings for the Intro Poles and Crossrail divisions will count towards champion/reserve awards.

Equitation classes will count towards the USHJA Outreach Program.

JUMPER DIVISIONS

SPECIFICATIONS

- Open Jumper Divisions: Divisions are open to JR, AM, and Professional riders. No cross entry restrictions. No combinations for .80m and below. USEF jumper tables and rules will be followed. .60m - .80m classes will run USEF Jumper Table IV.1 (Optimum time) and Table 2.C (Power & Speed), .90m - 1.30m classes will run USEF Jumper Table 2.C (Power & Speed) and Table 2.1 (Speed).
- Hunter Divisions: Traditional hunter attire and equipment is required. Judges will follow USEF/USHJA • rules for tack and equipment during competition. No martingales permitted in hack or flat classes. No boots or polo wraps in hunter classes. Under saddle classes with significant entries can be split into A and B groups upon judge's discretion. Intro Poles 13 & Under Open to JR riders ages 13 and under based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Poles classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required. Intro Poles 14 & Over Open to JR and AM riders ages 14 and over based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Poles classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required. Crossrails 13 & Under Open to JR riders ages 13 and under based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. Jumps not to exceed crossrail size with no jump fill. No lead changes are required. Crossrails 14 & Over Open to JR and AM riders ages 14 and under based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. Jumps not to exceed crossrail size with no jump fill. No lead changes are required. Short/Long Stirrup Hunters 2' Open to JR and AM riders. Changes of lead at the trot are optional in this division. No oxers. Pre-Green Hunters 2'3" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed. Modified Hunters 2'6" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/ USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed. Low Hunters 2'9" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed.

*All flat classes can be combined at judge's discretion with less than 2 entries, and split into A and B groups based on Judge's discretion with excessive entries. Equitation Classes: Intro Walk Trot Equitation Class to be judged at the walk and trot only. Open to JR and AM riders. Age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Points will count towards Intro division placings. Classes with excessive entries may be split into A and B groups at judge's discretion. Crossrails Walk Trot Canter Equitation Class to be judged at the walk, trot, and canter only. Open to JR and AM riders. Age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Points will count towards Crossrail division placings. Classes with excessive entries may be split into A and B groups at judge's discretion. Equitation over Poles Open to JR and AM riders, age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Poles classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Poles classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required. Equitation Crossrails Open to JR and AM riders, age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Jumps not to exceed crossrail height with no jump fill. Classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required. Equitation 2'9" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed. Classes will not count toward hunter division placings.

*All flat classes can be combined at judge's discretion with less than 2 entries, and split into A and B groups based on Judge's discretion with excessive entries. enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed.

- **Dressage Classes:** Open to all riders. Short vs Long court format will be determined by management based on schedule and availability. Traditional attire and equipment is suggested but not required. Please see dressage class no-show and scratch policy.
- TIP/Thoroughbred Only Classes: Classes are open to juniors, amateurs, and professionals riding thoroughbreds only. All thoroughbreds with or without Jockey Club Registration are eligible to compete. Horses do not need to be registered with TIP to enter. Additional TIP awards will be given for registered horses. Classes will be run together with regular classes and placed separately. Thoroughbred class placings do not count towards division placings in the hunter or jumper divisions.
 **TIP registration is available on site at the horse show next to the show office or online at https://tictip.com/ **
- .80m Sand Hill Equestrian Charity Classic: A speed style jumper class open to junior, amateur, and professional riders. 100% of entry fees collected for this class will be donated to a specified charity of the month. Prize money will be split accordingly: 30%, 20%, 15%, 13%, 12%, 10%.
- Horse & Hound: Rider, horse, and hound teams compete over a course of jumps to achieve the fastest time. Rider may choose to dismount and run with their hound or riders can choose to dismount and tag in a teammate to complete the hound portion of the course.
- Egg & Spoon Challenge: Open to all riders. Riders will be challenged to ride while holding an egg on a spoon in one hand. Riders must only use one hand and hold the spoon only without touching the egg. Riders may be asked to walk, trot, sitting trot, canter, or ride without stirrups. In the event of a tie riders may be asked to jump a small jump. The last rider to have their egg wins. 100% of class entry fees will be donated to B.O.K. Ranch.

\$250 Sand Hill Equestrian Hunter Derby: Open to all riders. Placings do not count towards hunter sections for champion & reserve awards. 2', 2'3, 2'6, 2'9 heights included. Class will be run on an open card with all heights combined for final placings at the end of the day. To be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. Once the judge's score is given, one point will be added for each option fence jumped. Classes are open to juniors, amateurs, and professionals. No schooling rounds allowed. Prize money will be split accordingly: 30%, 20%, 15%, 13%, 12%, 10%.

*SHEE Hunter Derby is USHJA Outreach eligible

- **CWD Woodside Medal 2'3":** Class is open to Junior & Adult Amateur riders only that are not showing in any 2'9" or above class. This class will be run in a hunter competition arena over an equitation course of fences with a minimum of 8 jumps not to exceed 2'3 in height. Tests may be included by the course designer and can include USEF equitation tests 1-17. Finals of the CWD Medal will be held at the Fall Finale show. All riders who have won a ribbon in a CWD Medal class during the regular season are automatically eligible to compete in the medal finals class at the Fall Finale. Finals will consist of two rounds, the first being a regular CWD Medal class which is open to all riders. The second round will be a work off/medal final round. Work off tests are allowed at the judge's discretion and can include USEF equitation tests 1-17. Winner of the finals will receive a voucher for a CWD bridle! Reserve champion will receive a saddle pad.
- Woodside Jumper Medal .60m, .70m, .80m, .90m, 1.00m: Class is open to Junior & Adult Amateur riders. Riders may not cross enter into multiple heights at the same show. To be shown over a course of at least 10 fences at the specified jumper height (.60m, .70m, .80m, .90m, 1.00m). This class will be run in a jumper style competition arena. No timers or time allowed will be used. The judge will start the round with a whistle/signal to the rider to start the course. To be judged on hands, seat guidance, & control of the horse for a jumper style ride. Jumper bits and equipment are allowed. Traditional turnout is required and judges will follow USEF/USHJA rules. Jumping penalties follow USEF Equitation rules. Limit 2 refusals. Finals of the medal will be held at the Woodside Fall Finale. All riders who have competed in a Jumper Medal class during the regular season are automatically eligible to compete in the medal finals class at the Fall Finale. Medal finals will consist of two rounds, the first being a regular Jumper Medal class which is open to all riders. The second round will be a work off/medal final round.
- Almaden Farms JR/AM: To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences 2'9 in height, with two changes of lead after the first fence, and MAY include one combination which must include an oxer. Two or more tests will be incorporated in the original course. No work-off is required. Two contestants must complete the course. Points awarded 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2. 1st & 2nd place winners qualify for the finals.

- Cloverleaf Jumper Challenge: Open only to JR & AM riders not showing in any jumper classes during this show year over 3'3" (1.0m). To be judged over a jumper course of not less than 9 fences at 2'7 (.80m) in height. To be judged under the rules of any/all USEF jumper tables. Any jumper type bit or equipment is allowed except for draw reins. At least 2 riders must enter for the class to be a qualifier for the finals. All ribbon winners qualify for finals. The Cloverleaf Challenge finals will be held at Brookside during the Fall Finale show. The finals will consist of 2 rounds, held over 2 separate days. With a final jump-off of the top 10 from the first 2 rounds combined scored and/or all riders with combined clean round scores. Champion of the finals will earn a golf cart, reserve champion wins \$1,000 shopping certificate, 3rd through 10th will all receive prizes. Previous winners of the cloverleaf equitation challenge finals are not eligible for the Cloverleaf Jumper Challenge Finals.
- Madden Xrail Medal JR/AM: RIDERS IN THIS MEDAL MAY NOT BE SHOWING OVER 1'9 (CROSS RAIL) DURING THIS SHOW YEAR. OPEN ONLY TO JR/AM RIDERS. TROTTING AND/OR CANTERING ON COURSE ALLOWED. TO BE JUDGED ON A RIDERS EQUITATION OVER A COURSE OF CROSS RAIL FENCES OF NOT LESS THAN 8 FENCES WITH AT LEAST TWO ADDITIONAL EQUITATION TESTS INCLUDED IN THE COURSE. ANY ADDITIONAL TESTING IS AT THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION. ALL RIDERS EARNING A RIBBON IN THE QUALIFYING CLASSES ARE QUALIFIED FOR THE FINALS. AT LEAST 3 RIDERS MUST ENTER THE CLASS FOR IT TO COUNT AS A QUALIFIER. ALSO, IN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR THE FINALS, RIDERS MUST HAVE SHOWN, AND WON A RIBBON, IN AT LEAST ONE QUALIFYING CLASS AT A BROOKSIDE SHOW, (NOT AT FALL FINALE) DURING THE TIME FROM FINALS TO FINALS. FINALS WILL BE HELD AT THE BROOKSIDE FALL FINALE. THE CHAMPION WILL EARN A GOLF CART, RES. CHAMPION A \$1000 SHOPPING CERTIFICATE. ONCE A RIDER HAS WON A MADDEN MEDAL FINALS THEY ARE NO LONGER ELIGIBLE FOR THE FINALS.
- Paso Park 2'6" Medal: Hosted at the Paso Park Schooling Show Series, the Paso Park B Series, and other regional shows, the Paso Park Medal features fences not to exceed 2'6² in height. A minimum of two riders must complete the course in order for the round to qualify for points. The top four riders (if available) in the class may be asked to work off at the judge's discretion. Alternatively, the course designer may choose to integrate the test(s) into the posted course. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1-17. This class may be run in either a jumper or hunter competition arena; jumper-style tack is permitted, no time allowed is to be considered. This class is open to all junior and amateur riders. Riders may not cross enter in the Lindsay Ashburn Memorial Green Rider 2'0² Medal. Finals of the Paso Park Medal will be held at the Turkey Trot & Jump show. Points from shows hosting the medal between December 1 of the previous year through October 31 of the current year or at the Turkey Trot & Jump show are eligible to qualify a rider for the Finals. Points are to be awarded as follows: 1st 7pts, 2nd 5pts, 3rd 4pts, 4th 3pts, 5th 2pts, 6th 1pt. Riders with 7 points or more are invited to participate in the Paso Park Medal Final. Any rider that has previously won the Paso Park 3' Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.

Lindsay Ashburn Memorial Green Rider 2'0" Medal: Hosted at the Paso Park Schooling Show Series, the Paso Park B Series, and other regional shows, the Green Rider Medal features fences not to exceed 2'0[™] in height. Class is to be held over a hunter-style equitation style. A minimum of two riders must complete the course in order for the round to qualify for points. The top four riders (if available) in the class may be asked to work off at the judge's discretion. Alternatively, the course designer may choose to integrate the test(s) into the posted course. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1-6 and 10-13. This class is open to all junior and amateur riders who have not competed at heights above 3'. Riders may not cross enter in the Paso Park Medal. Finals of the Green Rider Medal will be held at the Turkey Trot & Jump show. Points from shows hosting the medal between December 1 of the previous year through October 31 of the current year or at the Turkey Trot & Jump show are eligible to qualify a rider for the Finals. Points are to be awarded as follows: 1st – 7pts, 2nd – 5pts, 3rd – 4pts, 4th – 3pts, 5th – 2pts, 6th – 1pt. Riders with 7 points or more are invited to participate in the Green Rider Medal Final. Any rider that has previously won the Green Rider Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.
